

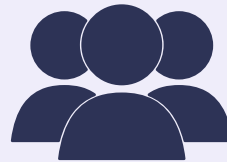

What does HDC do?



Explores big questions to help improve the lives of Hartford residents.



Centers community members to support community data-driven policy making.

How does HDC work?



Securely and ethically links various datasets from multiple community agencies.



Keeps your clients' information safe and protected through legal frameworks.

What are the benefits of joining HDC?



Once linked, the data can provide population-level insights on service access, outcomes, and/or other services and supports.



These insights enable community agencies to work collectively to create policies and programs that help residents thrive.



The insights can also help community agencies allocate limited funding and resources where they are most needed.

What questions is HDC currently exploring?

- What is the number of Hartford youth receiving public services?
- Where and when do youth access services?
- Do Hartford youth receiving services have better outcomes than similar youth that do not?
- What programs targeting youth are most cost-effective?
- Which formerly incarcerated men, women, and youth benefit from services offered by the Reentry Welcome Center?
- Do Reentry Welcome Center participants have lower rates of recidivism than other formerly incarcerated residents?

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
